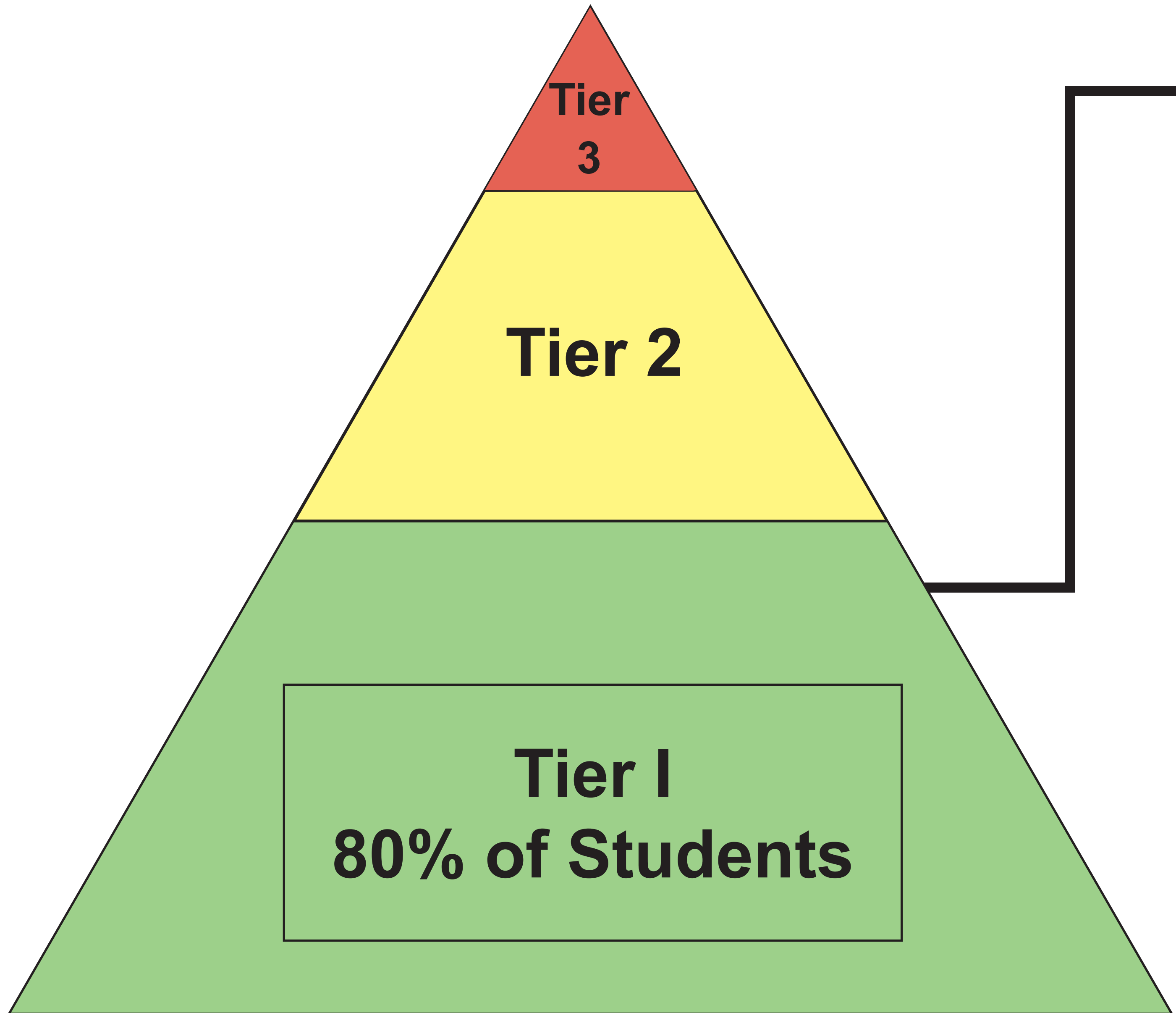


# Response to Intervention

## Tier 1 – Strategy Examples



### Examples of Intervention Strategies with in the classroom setting:

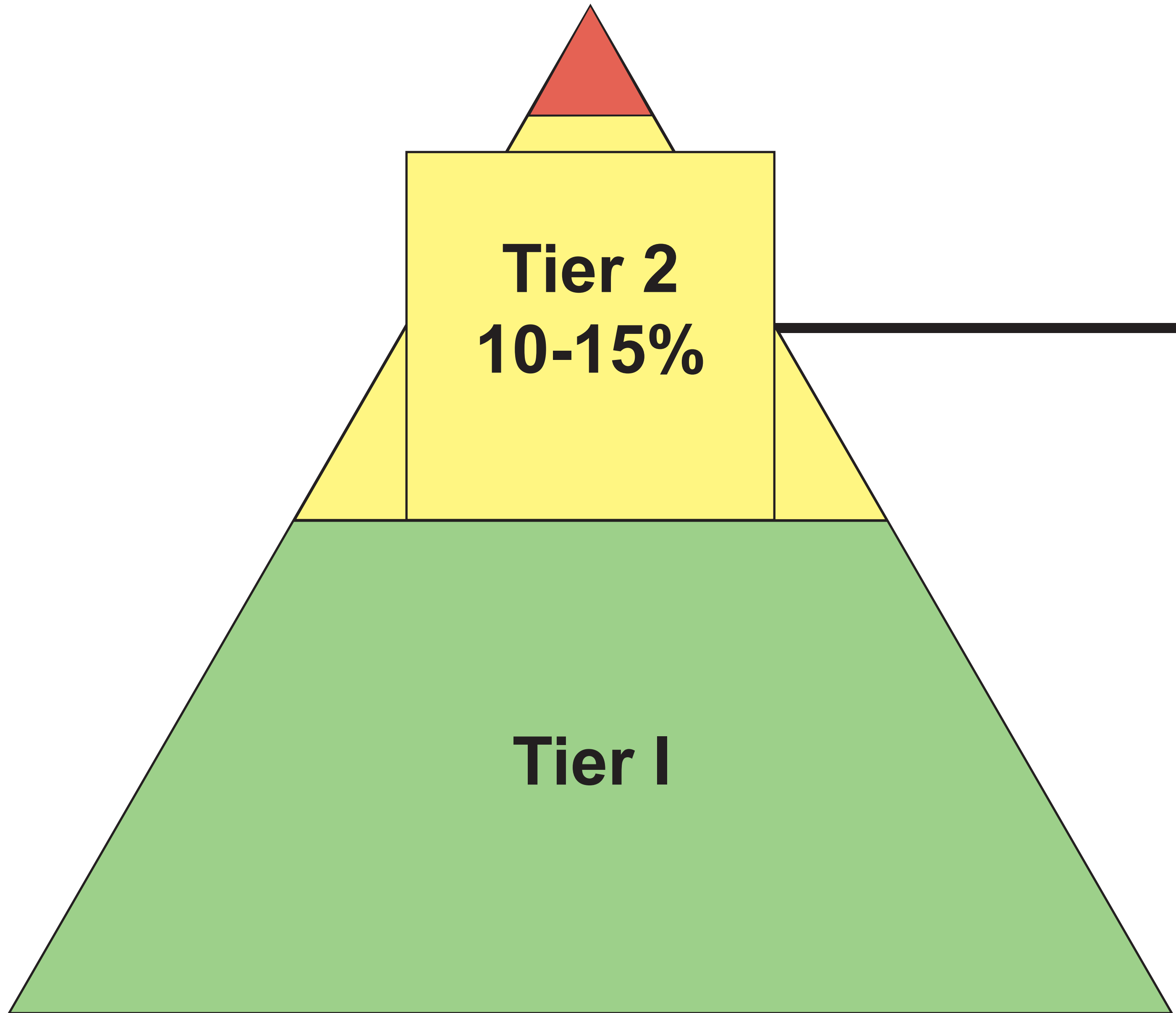
- Small Group instruction
- Peer reading buddies
- Hard copy of notes
- Preferential seating
- Frequent breaks
- Reduce length of assignments
- Allow extra time to complete assignments
- Daily planner
- Provide immediate feedback
- Not penalized for spelling errors
- Chance to redo failing assignments
- Read worksheets/instructions out loud
- More white space on pages
- Larger print
- Alternative assignments
- Multiplication chart
- Use of calculator
- Use of word bank
- Reduce number of questions
- Tutoring
- Increased use of manipulatives
- Partial credit given for attempts
- Outline given for note taking
- Page number given in study materials
- Grading adaptations
- Preview of assignments

### Behavioral Tier 1 examples:

- Clearly defined limits
- Frequent reminder of rules
- Frequent eye contact and proximity control
- Frequent breaks
- Private discussion of behavior
- Supervision during all transition activities
- In class time out
- Behavior contract
