Frequent breaks

Private discussion of behavior

Supervision during all transition activities


In class time out

Small Group instruction Peer reading buddies Hard copy of notes Preferential seating Frequent breaks Reduce length of assignments Allow extra time to complete assignments Daily planner Provide immediate feedback Not penalized for spelling errors Chance to redo failing assignments Read worksheets/instructions out loud More white space on pages Larger print Alternative assignments Multiplication chart Use of calculator Use of word bank Reduce number of questions Tutoring Increased use of manipulatives Partial credit given for attempts Outline given for note taking Page number given in study materials Grading adaptations


